"I'd never felt this feeling before, when people help you for no reason at all."

Nazar, his wife, and young daughter arrived in Boston after fleeing the war in Ukraine, Catholic Charities' Welcome Circles program helped them find furniture and household items for their new apartment, medical resources, and a local preschool referral. Nazar's daughter is learning English while he and his wife work multiple jobs and do what they can to still support others impacted by the war. "I need to feed my family, and I won't forget about Ukraine."

Promise was 21 and had just begun classes to earn her high school equivalency degree from Catholic Charities HiSet program in Lynn when she unexpectedly discovered she was going to be a mother. With the support of her teachers and the case management team, she managed to successfully complete her degree while caring for her newborn and is now training for a career in sthetics and massage. "One day, when my daughter is six or seven years old, I want her to think to herself, 'I hope to be like my mom'," she said.

From responding to major crises seen in the news to addressing injustices and inequities in our communities, here's how you made an impact this year:



BASIC NEEDS

- **Opened a regional market pantry in Lynn** serving approximately 250 families a day that provides nutritious food and community resources, a major step forward in our commitment to establish a food security network across the Archdiocese that along with our other 5 pantries provided nearly 2.6 million meals to over 11,000 homes this year.
- Partnered with the Commonwealth to help address the housing crisis by opening Catholic Charities Inn, an emergency family shelter in Boston that provides a safe place to sleep, basic necessities, and case management support for those seeking permanent housing.
- Ensured that 400 adults, children, and adolescents had access to guality mental health services through our Family Guidance and Counseling Center, regardless of age, background, or socioeconomic status.

REFUGEE & IMMIGRANT SERVICES

- Served nearly 80 newly arrived clients from Ukraine, Haiti, and Cuba through Welcome Circles, a new volunteer initiative that supports people in finding housing, education, employment, and community resources.
- Supported 2,632 people in our Family Group Legal Orientation and Immigration Court Helpdesk programs.

ADULT EDUCATION & WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

- Education Center, creating a spacious, modern new space in Jamaica Plain that supports approximately 355 students annually to learn English and developing the job skills needed to attain employment.
- Helped address the critical shortage of health care workers across the U.S. by providing scholarships to Nursing Assistant/Home Health Aide program students and

developed an innovative Healthcare Bridge ESOL program.

FAMLY & YOUTH SERVICES

- Awarded a total of 4 Universal PreK classrooms in partnership with Boston Public Schools for Yawkey Child Care in Dorchester and Labouré Child Care in South Boston. enabling the Agency to offer free preschool to Boston residents with children ages 3 & 4 in 2024.
- Expanded our Healthy Families program into Boston, collectively providing home-based parenting support and guidance to over 200 first-time parents under the age of 23 throughout Boston, the North Shore, and Merrimack Valley.
- Introduced a new Sunset Point Camp Day option for families from Hull and the surrounding communities, allowing more local children to cultivate new friendships and develop lifelong memories.
